Increasingly in the current climate Art Therapists need to evidence their practice.

Audio Image Recording (AIR) is an innovative format in collecting the client's reflections on their art therapy experience through their art work as both a tool for reviewing therapy, as qualitative evidence and as a platform for the service user's voice. This is then put onto a DVD for the client take away at the end of therapy as a transitional object.

AIRs can be used as clinical summaries and have extended benefits for the client. It also provides a way to promote and inform others about Art Therapy and acts as an advocacy tool.

Mark Braniff and Julie Brooker are offering a half day training on the practicalities of making an AIR.

The aim of this practical workshop is to teach participants through practical steps how to:

- Conduct a semi structured end of art therapy interview
- Make an audio recording
- Digitally photograph art work
- Upload on to a computer
- Edit an audio recording (for different audiences)
- Make a finished AIR
